## **Re: NATIONAL BATTERY STORAGE REGISTER CONSULTATION**

CitiPower Pty Ltd and Powercor Australia Ltd welcome the opportunity to respond to the Council of Australian Governments Energy Council's (**Energy Council**) National Battery Storage Register Consultation.

We support the proposal to develop a register of small scale battery installations. We also support Jacobs' report for the Energy Council that the register be hosted by the Australian Energy Market Operator or the Clean Energy Regulator. A single register host (i.e. option 1 or 2) would:

- obviate the need for us, and likely other distributors, to each upgrade their IT systems which
  would be more costly. Our existing systems would not facilitate the proposed information
  requirements without modification and we currently have no plans to undertake such
  investment; and
- ensure information is collected, validated and displayed consistently and without the need for protocols to be developed.

Jacobs report considered the types of information that should be made available on the register to distributors. We propose:

- 'NMI identifier (or postcode)' be changed to 'NMI identifier and postcode'. The postcode
  location of a battery installation is not useful to distributors that need to manage load flows and
  technical constraints on individual feeders and transformers; and
- to add 'short term peak output (if applicable)' to 'Capacity (continuous kW, and storage kWh)'. Understanding short term peak output capabilities will better allow distributors to contract with battery owners and operators to alleviate network constraints.
